Court at dividing fees and by consideration of our said court, obtained his Execution of a certain Judgment
against a certain Henry Williams of Stegney Parish, ~~of Somersett~~^{in the} County and planter and also his wife
admit of a certain Thomas Taylor late of Somersett County dec^d. as well as the sum of eight hundred and
eighty five pounds of tobacco a certain debt together with the sum of two hundred and fifteen pounds
of tobacco for cost of suit, as also the sum of two hundred and sixty one pounds of tobacco by the court
here adjudged for additional costs in the Judgment specified, as also the sum of two hundred and twenty
three pounds of tobacco by the court here adjudged unto the said Benj^m for his costs and damage, but
caused by reason of Delay of Execution of the Judgment and all which sums are to be levied on
the goods and chattels which were of the afo^d Thomas Taylor at the time of his death and which to the
hands of the afo^d Henry Williams and also his wife admit as afo^d should after same to be diminished
of so much thereof, in their hands they have, whereof they are convict, as by the records and proceeding
hereof in our said court, Remaining, before our Justice, at Dividing fees manifestly appeareth
and altho^r the Judgment afo^d as yet Remained unsatisfied as by the Information of the said Benj^m
we have Received, and because we are willing that those things which in our said court are Rightfully
done should come to due Execution we command you that by good and Lawfull men of your Bailywick
you make known unto the afo^d Henry Williams and also his wife that they be and appear before
our said Justice, at our County Court of Somersett to be held at Dividing fees the third Tuesday of
August next, to shew cause if any thing for themselves they have or knoweth to say wherefore
the afo^d Benj^m his Execution of the Judgment afo^d against the afo^d Henry Williams and also his wife
admit afo^d according to the form of the Recovery afo^d brought not to have it to that place seem
equivalent, and have you then and there the names of those before whom you made the same known
and his Writ Witnessd Sand Hopkins Gent^{leman}

All which said third Tuesday of August to wit the eighteenth day of the same month and year give them
said seven hundred and twenty seven being the day of the return of the said writ Court the afo^d Benj^m
Waite, by his attorney afo^d and the same returned afo^d that by virtue of his Lordships will afo^d to him directed
he had made known unto the afo^d Henry Williams and also his wife admit afo^d that they be
before his said Lordships Justice, at dividing fees the third Tuesday of August then next that is
to say by John Doe and Richard Doe honest and Lawfull men of his Bailywick

And the afo^d Henry Williams and also his wife admit afo^d altho^r so before warned, being so
unjustly called cause not but made default

Therefore it is considered by the court here that the afo^d Benj^m Waite have his Execution against the
afo^d Henry Williams and also his wife admit afo^d of the afo^d Thomas Taylor for as were the sum of fifteen
hundred and eighty four pounds of tobacco his debt and £1, afo^d above specified as also the sum
226 of Two hundred & twenty six .. pounds of tobacco which to the afo^d Benjamin by the same
Court here were adjudged, according to the form of the Statute now of lately made and provided
