Court at dividing Creek and by consideration of our said Court, obtained his Execution of a certain Judgment against a certain Henry Williams of Stegney Parish, ~~of Somerset County~~ ^{in the County of} planter and also his wife and also of a certain Thomas Taylor late of Somerset County, dec^d. as well of the sum of Eight hundred and Eighty five pounds of tobacco a certain debt together with the sum of two hundred and fifteen pounds of tobacco for of duty, as also the sum of two hundred and sixty one pounds of tobacco by the Court here adjudged for additional for in the Judgment specified, as also the sum of two hundred and twenty three pounds of tobacco by the Court here adjudged unto the said Benj^t for his for and damages sustained by reason of Delay of Execution of the Judgment and all which sums are to be levied on the goods and Chattels which were of the said Thomas Taylor at the time of his death and which to the hands of the said Henry Williams and also his wife and also as should after some to be administered if so much thereof, in their hands they have, where of they are Conit, as by the Records and proceeding thereof in our said Court, Remaining, before our Justice at dividing Creek manifestly appeareth and altho' the Judgment are as yet Remaineth unsatisfied as by the Jurisdiction of the said Benj^t we have Received, and because we are willing that those things which in our said Court are Rightfully done should come to due Execution we Command you that by good and Lawful men of your Bailiwick you make known unto the said Henry Williams and also his wife that they be and appear before our said Justice at our County Court of Somerset to be hold at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August next, to show Cause if any thing for themselves they have or knoweth to say wherefore the said Benj^t his Execution of the Judgment are against the said Henry Williams and also his wife and also according to the form of the Recovery are brought not to have it to them it shall seem Expedient, and have you then and there the names of those before whom you make the same known and this Writ Writ of Sand Hogkin Seal &c

Att which said third Tuesday of August to wit the eighteenth day of the same month and said Benj^t said seven hundred and twenty seven being the day of the Return of the said Writ Cometh the said Benj^t Waite, by his attorney and the said returned of that by virtue of his Lordships writ and to him directed he had made known unto the said Henry Williams and also his wife and also as that they be before his said Lordships Justice at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August then next that is to say by John Doe and Richard Roe honest and Lawful men of his Bailiwick &c

And the said Henry Williams and also his wife and also altho' so before warned, being solemnly called came not but made default &c

Therefore it is Considered by the Court here that the said Benj^t Waite have his Execution against the said Henry Williams and also his wife and also of the said Thomas Taylor for as well the sum of fifteen hundred and eighty four pounds of tobacco his debt and for, as above specified as also the sum of Two hundred & twenty six .. pounds of tobacco which to the said Benjamin by the same Court here were adjudged, according to the form of the Statute therof lately made and provided
