Eight nine at Stogin's Parish in Somerset County and within the Jurisdiction of this Court was indebted unto the said Patrick in the sum of two pounds seven shillings and five pence current money of Maryland as by an account hereunto annexed may in Court appear and so thereof being indebted the said Joseph in consideration of the time and place as did upon himself assume, and to the same Patrick then and there did faithfully promise that the said sum of two pounds seven shillings & five pence, he would pay and content when he should be thereto requested nevertheless the same Joseph by his promise and assumption as in form as made little regarding but plotting and fraudulently intended to deceive the said Patrick in that Court to receive the said sum of two pounds seven shillings & five pence he hath not paid but the same to pay hath denied and still doth deny to the damage of the said Patrick of six pounds six shillings and three pence and therefore brings this suite.

Personally appeared before me the Subscriber one of the Lord Proprietors and Clerk of the Peace for Somerset County ^{Esq} Patrick Symon and made Oath in the Holy Evangelist that the above account is just and true as it stands stated and that he hath paid no part and parcel thereof in testimony whereof I have set my hand and Seal this 6 day of March 1729

And the said Joseph Holder in his own proper person comes and defends the force and injury when he said and says that he cannot give any account of the said Patrick, nor but that he did upon himself assume in manner and form as the said Patrick above against him (England) and as to the damage of the same Patrick by him by occasion of the premises in that part sustained, the same Joseph says and confesseth that the said Patrick has sustained damage by occasion of the premises besides his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part approved to two pounds seven shillings and five pence current money and not more and because the said Patrick this not deny but the same allegation confesseth to be true pray Judgment and those damages above confessed together with his costs and charges as to him adjudged &c.

Therefore by Consent of the Parties as it is considered that the said Patrick Symon recover against the said Joseph Holder his damages as to the said two pounds seven shillings and five pence current money, by the same Joseph in form as confessed as also Two hundred & fifteen pounds of to be for his costs and charges as to the same Patrick at his request by a Court here and of the Court of the Parties as adjudged which certain damages in the whole do amount to two pounds seven shillings and five pence and
