Pet" The humble Petition of James Edwells humbly sheweth, That whereas your petition
is entituled to land in his possession containing five hundred acres called first Gloucetowne lying in the
County and the bounds whereof are much decayed and the boundaries to prove them ancient and
Inferior, wherefore your petitioner prays your worshipps to grant him a Commission to perpetuate
the bounds of said land according to act of Assembly in such case provided and your petitioner as in

The Petition abd being read and heard and the premises considered, Wherefore it is ordered by
the Court that Commission issue to John Handy, James Memrie, Thomas Humphrys and John Record esq; all
of Somersett County Gent; and that they execute the same according to Law &c.

Edward Roberts The Petition of Edward Roberts sheweth That your petitioner is much defrauded
with two roads that lead through the middle of his plantation to Richard Waller, to the great
Prejudice of your petitioner it would be as convenient for the said Richard Waller, and of great
benefitt to your petitioner, wherefore your petitioner doth humbly desire that your worshipps would be
pleased to admitt him to turn the road or nominate any two men that they may appoint where the said
Road may be turned, without Prejudice to your petitioner and your petitioner as in duly bound shall
ever pray -- The Petition abd being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation
thereupon had. Wherefore it is considered by the Court that the said Edward Roberts turn the said road
(according to the direction of certain Robert Jones and Thomas Lewis) as by the Petition abd is graud
ed

Abraham Lamberson The Petition of Abraham Lamberson humbly sheweth - That whereas
the road leading from Mr. Hopkins Mill to Bentown does passe thorow your petitioners land abd
which to his damage your petitioner desires the favour of your worshipps to have leave to remove
the same about a hundred yards further out and your petitioner will take care to better and neighbor
road and your petitioner as in duly bound shall ever pray -

The Petition abd being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation
thereupon had Wherefore it is considered that the said Abraham Lamberson turn the road as by the peti-
tion abd is graud, so far that the new road be made as good and passable as the old, and that it be made
and done according to the direction of Wm Lane and Philip Quinton of the County Gent, and that the
old road be kept open till the new one finished and made good &c.

Ordered by the Court that Ge: John Jones pay unto John Murray out of the fines five pounds
ten Shillings current money for Help for the Court house &c.
