Prejudice of your petitioner it would be as convenient for the said Richard Wallis, and of great
benefit to your petitioner, wherefore your petitioner doth humbly desire that your worshipps would be
pleased to admit him to turn the road or nominate any two men that they may appoint where the said
Road may be turned, without Prejudice to your Petitioner and your petitioner as in duty bound shall
ever pray --- The Petition afo being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation
thereupon had, wherefore it is considered by the Court that the afo Edward Roberts turn the said road
(according to the direction of certain Robert Jones and Thomas Jones) as by the Petition afo is granted
&c.

Abraham Lamberson | To the worshipfull Justices of Somerset County in Court sitting
Pet^r... The humble Petition of Abraham Lamberson humbly sheweth - that whereas
the road leading from Mr. Roghins Mill to Benston Dam passeth throu your petitioners land
so much to his damage your petitioner desires the favour of your worshipps to have leave to remove
the same about ahundred yards further out and your petitioner will take care to repair and neighbor
load and your petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray -

The petition afo being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation -
thereupon had wherefore it is considered that the afo Abraham Lamberson turn the road as by the peti-
tion afo is granted, so far that the new road be made as good and passable as the old, and that it be made
and done according to the direction of Wm Lane and Philip Dunton of the County Gent^l, and that the
old load be kept open till the new one finished and made good &c.

Ordered by the Court that Ge^t John Jones pay unto John Murray out of the fines five pounds
ten shillings current money for glass for the Court house &c.
