Bruce, William Mair, Thos^r Webb, W^r Gray who being duly elected byed and sworn, to say the truth in the
premises upon their oaths do say that the aforesaid John Filman is not guilty of the broach and conversion as
the aforesaid Margaret Waile above against him hath complained W^r -

Therefore it is considered that the aforesaid Marg^r Waile take nothing by her will and declaration aforesaid
but be in mercy for her false rumour and that the aforesaid John Filman go thereof without day, and further it is
considered by the Court here that the aforesaid John Filman Recover against the aforesaid Marg^r Waile One Thousand and
1070 Seventy pounds of tobacco for his cost and charges by him about his defense
in that part pretended to the same John by the Court here according to the form of the Statute. Whereof lately
made and provided adjudged, and that the same John have thereof payment W^r -

Charity Tully, John Tully and Alexander Tully their heirs Esq^r adwt. or apies to the whiche payment were
and truly to be made and done we bind our selves our and either of them Heirs Esq^r and adwt. for the
whole and in the whole County and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seal and dated
this 19th day of November anno domini 1729 -

The condition of the above Obligation is such that whereas the Commissary Gen^r
Capt^r has remitted into this Court the amount of the estate of Edward Tully deceased whereupon it is found that
there is balance due to the abovesaid Orphans the sum of thirty two pounds one shilling and nine
pence. It Therefore the abovesaid Christopher Bruce Robert Hardy & Thomas Holbrook or any
or either of them, or any or either of their heirs Executors or adwt. do and shall well and truly pay or cause to
be paid unto the aforesaid Orphans the aforesaid sum of thirty two pounds one shilling and nine pence in equall
parts or portions when they shall attain to full age to receive the same according to act of Assembly
in such case made and provided that the above Obligation to be void of none effect otherwise to remain
in full force and vertue -
