

Ld. Richard Bywater
vs. Thomas Billen

Command was given to the sherr. of somerset County that he should take
Thomas Billen late of somerset County prisoner if he should be found
in his bay ward and him should safe keep so that he might have his body
before the Justice of his Lordship's County Court of somerset to be held at dividing creek the third
tuesday of August, next to answer unto Richard Bywater of a plea of trespass upon the
Case &c. and that thereof he should not fail &c.

At which said third tuesday of August to witt the nineteenth day of the same month
and day. One thousand seven hundred and twenty nine being the day of the return of the said
writ Cometh the said Richard Bywater by Lewis Gale his attorney and the sherr. of somerset County
to whom the foregoing writ was directed likewise Cometh and make the return thereof to the
Court here before in these words viz. Legi. Legum et John Burnall sherr. —

And the said Thomas Billen by Francis Allen his attorney Cometh and defends the
force and injury when &c. and prays leave to dispute hereunto until the next Court and he
take it and the same day is given to the said Billen here also &c.

At which said next Court to witt the eighteenth day of November and day. One thou-
sand seven hundred and twenty nine Cometh again as was the said Richard Bywater as the said Thomas
Billen by their attorneys &c. and thereupon the said Richard Bywater then and there his writ &c.
against the said Thomas Billen ^{did not} ~~did not~~ ^{prevent} ~~prevent~~ with effect but voluntarily permitted his writ to
be discontinued —

Therefore afterwards viz. that is to say the same day by direction of the
Justice's Court were adjudged the same Thomas Billen one hundred fifty five — pounds
of tobacco for his cost and charges by him about his defence in that part sustained according to the
form of the Statute in such Case thereof lately made and provided and the said Richard in
mercy and the said Thomas have thereof Execution &c.

Ld. Thomas Walker
vs. Catherine Diall

Command was given to the sherr. of somerset that he should take Catherine Diall
late of somerset County prisoner if ^{she} should be found in his bay ward and
her should safe keep so that he might have her body before his Lordship's Justice
of the County Court of somerset to be held at dividing creek the third tuesday of November then next
to satisfy Thomas Walker of fifty hundred pence and eleven hundred and one pounds of tobacco
which to the said Thomas before his Lordship's Justice at dividing creek were adjudged for his damages which
he had by reason of a certain promise and assumption by the said Catherine ^{to the said Thomas} made and not performed whereof the
Consist &c.

At which said third tuesday of November to witt the eighteenth day of the same month
and day. One thousand seven hundred and twenty nine being the day of the return of the said writ Cometh
the said Thomas Walker by Lewis Gale his attorney and the sherr. of somerset County to whom the foregoing
writ was directed likewise Cometh and make the return thereof returned in these words viz. —
