John Turpin of Somerset County Gent. brings into Court a certain Mary Record who had run away and absented herself out of his service fifteen days, and prayeth that she may be adjudged to serve him for the same runaway time according to act of Assembly in that case provided. and likewise the said John Turpin prayeth that the said Mary Record may be adjudged to serve him for four hundred pounds of tobacco paid for buying her up when runaway as afo. Wherefore it is Considered by the Court that the said Mary Record serve her said Master his heirs or assigns six days for one which amounts in the whole to ninety days also the said Mary Record is adjudged to serve her said Master for the afo four hundred pounds of tobacco paid as afo three months or ninety days which said service of ninety days for runaway time and ninety days for the tobacco paid as afo amounts in the whole to one hundred and eighty days, the said Mary Record to serve her said Master his heirs and assigns one hundred and eighty days after the expiration of her already servitude &c
