His Lordship } John Redding appears according to his recognizance Entered into before Wm. Claunter one
of his Lordships Justices of the Peace for Somerset County, and is discharged therefrom
John Redding } and ordered to give new recognizance & in appearance at June Court next

Whereupon the said John Redding with Nathaniel Britningham his security both present here
in Court in their proper persons acknowledge themselves to owe and stand duly indebted unto his
said Lord for the sum of ~~£~~ 1000 Sterling good and lawfull money of England of their goods and
 Chattells Lands and tenements to be severately made and paid to the use of his said Lord King his heirs
and assigns if default be made in the Condition hereunder written

The Condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bounden John Redding do &
 shall make his personal appearance before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to
 be hold at ~~mid~~ week the third Wednesday of June next and answer unto his said Lordship concerning
 all such matters and things as shall be then and there objected against him on his said Lordships
 behalf, and stand and abide the Judgment of the Court thereon and do not depart the same Court without
 License thereof then the above recognizance to be void and of none Effect otherwise

To the worshipfull his Lordships Justice of Somerset County now in
 Court sitting the humble Petition of John Clandman, sheweth that
 your petitioner is unjustly detained as a servant by Southy Whittington
 a figure of William Whittington, and your Petitioner desires that he

shall be served longer than his time having served four years and five months for debt to
 the said Southy Whittington who refuses to set your Petitioner at liberty or to come to an end with
 your petitioner therefore your petitioner humbly prays your worshipps will be pleased to set your
 Petitioner or to compell Southy Whittington to come to an account with him and your petitioner
 as in duty bound will pray &c

The Petition afo^e being read and heard, and al and singular the severall allegations
 as well on the part of the petitioner as on the part of the said Southy Whittington who were
 both present in Court in their proper persons, and mature deliberation thereupon had --
 Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said John Clandman Return home into his
 masters Service and serve out his term of servitude mentioned in his Indenture, and further it is
 ordered that the said Southy Whittington comply with his part of the Indenture to be performed
