by these presents sealed with our seals and dated the sixteenth day of June and year 1730 -

The condition of the above obligation is such that Whereas the Company General hath transmitted
into this Court the account of the Estate of Cornelius Eunis dec. where in it is found that there is Balance
due to the above said orphans the sum of Twenty seven pounds fourteen shillings and one penny current money
It therefore the said Mary Eunis Charles Bishop and Henry Derman or any of them or either of their heirs
Executors or Administrators shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid into the said orphans the said sum of
Twenty seven pounds fourteen shillings and one penny to be paid them according to the will of the said dec. and all
of a penalty in such case made and provided when they shall attain to full age. Than the above obligation to be
void and of none effect as to remain in full force and virtue -

In obedience to an act of assembly in Relations to Guardians & orphans. the subscribers viz
Ephraim Heather and James Rowd being nominated by a commissioner Got John Smith and accordingly on the eighth
day of April 1730. we the said Ephraim Heather and James Rowd entered on the land and plantation of a par-
-tial orphan named Richard Hill under the Guardian ship of a certain William Simpson which said land and
plantation lies on the seaboard side down a creek called Hill creek &c. and being sworn on the holy Evangelist
viewed the said land and plantation and find one Log dwelling house the dimensions of 20 foot long and
15 wide single covered one other Loged house in the woods of the same dimensions single covered and
both in bad repair also in one out house framed with the posts and studs in the ground 25 x 18 single
covered and very much decayed and out of repair as also an old apple orchard about 55 trees and some
Quince trees peach trees standing thick together and some young apple trees planted and torn to pieces and
about 12 hundred pannels of fence very much decayed and out of repair, some of the pannels on stiles
and some on Gates, we also allow it said Guardian the liberty of carrying upon any part of the said
orphans land that is adjoining and adjacent to the said plantation not exceeding fifty any of said
so Board with liberty of getting logs framing timber and boards upon any part of the said orphans land
only for the necessary use of the said orphans plantation fencing and house in order that the said
Guardian may thereby raise the Rents and defray the Charges of the said house orchard and fencing
