At which said next Court to witt the seventeenth day of March anno domini One thousand seven hundred and Twenty Nine came again as well the ^{defd} John Williamson by his attorney and horseyon the same day by his said attorney pray that the ^{defd} John may give security for costs in case his suit be obtained against him in the plea ^{defd} which is by the Court granted Horseyon afftani William Blanchard age somer

C County Blantyre present before Court in his proper person undertaken for the ^{defd} John Williamson that in case he be nonsuited in the plea ^{defd} or otherwise legally lost that then the ^{defd} John Williamson shall pay the damages afftani of the Court thereupon and all costs amounting to the ^{defd} Nathaniel Horsey or that he the ^{defd} William Blanchard will doe it for him

Wherupon the ^{defd} John Williamson by his said attorney pray that the ^{defd} Nathaniel Horsey to his declaration ^{defd} may answer but the same attorney ^{defd} Nathaniel sayeth that he is not informed by the same Nathaniel his plent of any answer for the same Nathaniel to the ^{defd} John in the plea ^{defd} to be given and nothing else he doth say by which the same John Removeth against the ^{defd} Nathaniel Horsey undefended — For which the same John his damages by reason of the non performance of the promise and assumption ^{defd} against the ^{defd} Nathaniel ought to recover but because it is not known what damages the ^{defd} John hath sustained by reason of the non performance of the promise and assumption ^{defd} Command is given to the Sherif of Somerell County that by the oath of honest and lawfull men of his Baylywiche or County and Diligently Enquire what damages the ^{defd} John hath sustained as well by reason of the non performance of the promise and assumption aforesaid as for his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part appeared and the Inquisition which therupon he take to his lordships Justices of the County Court of Somerell to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of June next under your seal and the seals of them by whose oaths you make at same Inquisition you send together with his said Lordships writ therof to him directed and the same day is given to the ^{defd} Nathaniel Williamson also $\text{£}0$

At which said third Tuesday of June to witt the sixteenth day of the same month anno domini One thousand seven hundred and thirty before his said Lordships Justices for Somerell County Court at Dividing Creek Cometh the ^{defd} John Williamson by his attorney and the Sheriff to witt John Burnall Gent^m Sherif off — somerell County ^{defd} and returned after an Inquisition before him at the Court house in somerell County off the sixth day of June One thousand seven hundred and thirty by the oath of honest and lawfull men of the said County taken by which it appears that the ^{defd} John Peale sustained Damage by reason of his Baylywiche, taken by which it appears that the ^{defd} John Peale sustained Damage by reason of the non performance of the promise and assumption ^{defd} beyond his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part appeared to four pounds and five pence current money of Maryland and for those costs & charges to one pound of tobacco

Therefore it is considered that the ^{defd} John Williamson recovereth the aforesaid Nathaniel Horsey his damages ^{defd} by the Inquisition ^{defd} above appears as also four hundred and forty eight pence current money of Maryland for his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part appeared to the ^{defd} John by the Court house at his request ^{defd} adjudged which certain Damages in the whole do amount to four pounds and six pence current money of Maryland and four hundred and forty four pounds of tobacco and ^{defd} debt in Money $\text{£}0$
