At which said Court to wit the fifteenth day of August anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and twenty seven came again as well the aforesaid Richard Chambers as the aforesaid

Edward Dickenson by their attorneys aforesaid, and the aforesaid Edmund Dickenson by his said attorney as before defendant the same and injury wherein he and says that he is not guilty of the premises, on the part above against him hath complained and for bridle thereof he putt himself upon the Country he and is left likewise he

Thereupon command is given unto the Sheriff of Somerset County that immediately he cause to have here twelve men by whom he who neither can to recognize he because as well he of which said Sheriff he said shall to wit the premises above mentioned to wit the same day and year last mentioned make return that he hath here ready twelve men as by his said receipt he was commanded and now he afterwards to wit the same day and year cause as well he and they as the aforesaid defendant by their attorneys aforesaid and the Jurors of that Jury thereon

Inpannelled being said twelve men came to wit, William Lane, Edward Jones, Richard Holland John Long, Thomas Long, John Townsend Judd, John Curwalt, John Holland, Jacob Thompson Christopher Glass, William Farmer, and Robert Collier, who being duly elected byed and sworn to say the truth of the premises upon their oaths do say that the aforesaid Edmund Dickenson is guilty of the premises as the part above against him hath complained, and do expect the damages of the same Richard beyond his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part he gaged to forty five shillings Court money and for his costs and charges to be paid off to him he

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Richard Chambers recover against the aforesaid Edmund Dickenson forty five shillings Court money the damages and by the jurors aforesaid assessed as also Nine hundred & thirty Seven pounds of tobacco for his costs and charges and to the aforesaid Richard by the Court here off his aforesaid increase adjudged which certain damages in the whole do amount unto forty five shillings Court money and pounds of tobacco and the aforesaid debt in Mercy he

By the Pitts Soudell vs. Thos.
