lodging and clothing mete for such a servant to have and wear during his servitude and &c

Whereupon it is Ordered by the Court that the said George Stringer give recognizance  
in twenty pounds Sterling to pay with the Servants and &c

Thereupon the said George Stringer present here in Court acknowledged him-  
self to owe and be indebted unto the said Joshua Sargent in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling  
good and lawfull money of England to be levied of his body good or chattels lands or tenements  
for the use of the said Joshua Sargent his heirs and assigns if default be made in the condition  
hereunder written.

The Condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound George Stringer  
do and shall leave the said Joshua Sargent the trade of a Shoemaker and to lead during his  
servitude, and to give him a young sow when he shall arrive at the age of sixteen years, and to  
find him sufficient meat drink washing Lodging and clothing mete for such a servant to have  
and wear during his servitude and &c then where he goes to be  
bound & discharged &c

To the worshipful Justices of Somerset County,

now in court sitting - The humble Pet<sup>t</sup> of William Selby and James Martin  
Sheweth that whereas your worshipps Ordered John Dennis to bear a load from the main  
Road just by Mr Morris's through the Indian Town to Snow hill - now so it is, the said  
road being cleared, by the said John Dennis is off such consequence to your worshipps  
petitioners, that it deprives us of our orchards and of keeping of pasture, in such places  
as may afford our creatures water, with severall other prejudice, as your petitioners will  
be ready to make appear to your worshipps - The premises considered and your  
worshippes ordering of the said load to be altered will oblige your petitioners to pray for  
your worshipps

The Petition and being read and mature deliberation thereupon had, Wherefore  
it is Considered by the Court that the <sup>said</sup> load be turned, and that John Dennis and Willm.  
Laws lay out a new load from the <sup>old</sup> Main load just by Mr Morris's, to Snow hill, and  
that John Dennis clear it same according to their direction &c

John Roach of somerset County comes here into court and brings with him his Servant  
woman Mary Richards, who had absented herself out of his service thirty five days  
and pray the Court that according to law she may be adjudged to serve him for the same  
thereupon
