find a good boat, and to give good attendance thereto, for the ferrying of horse and man  
over the said river, &c —

In consideration whereof the said John Hardy is to be  
allowed by the year the sum of three thousand and pounds of tobacco &c —

Ordered by the Court that William Groom be allowed for the future for keeping of a  
ferry over the Indian River, and finding a good boat, and good attendance, the sum  
two thousand pounds of tobacco for year &c —
