Therefore it is considered by the Court that the s^d Joseph M^oyster recover against the s^d John Brome in custody as s^d the sum of six p^ounds sixteen shillings and six pence Court money and three hundred and fifteen p^ounds of tobacco by damages s^d above in the declaration s^d Expressed as also two hundred and sixty two --- p^ounds of tobacco for his costs and charges by him about his Suit in that part Expressed to the same Joseph by the Court hereof his s^d award adjudged, and the s^d debt in mercy ^{he} --- And afterwards on the twenty first day of Novemb. and Dow. One thousand seven hundred and twenty seven the said John Brome present heren Court in custody of the Sherr. of Somerset County s^d, and thereupon the said John Brome at the prayer of the s^d attorney s^d is committed againe into the custody of the said Sherr. until the said Joseph M^oyster of his damages s^d should be fully satisfied, the said Sherr. Present heren Court took charge of the said John Brome accordingly ^{he} ---

John Murray } Command was given to the Sherrife of Somerset ^{County}
 Philip Taylor } that he should take Philip Taylor late of Somerset County
 if he should be found in his Bailiwick and him should
 safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordship
 County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of Novemb.
 next to answer unto John Murray of a plea of trespass upon the case ^{he} and that
 thereof he should not fail ^{he} --- And s^d John Murray by Lewis Gale
 his attorney declared against the s^d Philip Taylor in the plea s^d as follow:
 Somers^{et}. Philip Taylor late of Somerset County planter
 was attached to answer unto s^d Murray of a plea of trespass upon the case ^{he} ---
 And whereupon ^{John by} Lewis Gale his attorney Complain^t that whereas
 the s^d Philip the Eighteenth day of April and Dow one thousand seven
 hundred and twenty seven at Snow Hill in Somerset County within the Jurisdiction
 of this Court was Indebted unto the same John in Six hundred & Eighty one p^ounds
 of tob^o. for divers goods wares and Merchandises by the s^d J^o to s^d Philip
