same Joseph by the court hereof his aforesaid adjudged, and the aforesaid debt in money &c
alid afterwards videlicet the twenty first day of Novem. and Dow. One thousand seven hundred
and twenty seven the said John Browne present herein Court in custody of the Shrd. of Somersett
County aforesaid and thereupon the said John Browne at the prayer of the aforesaid attorney aforesaid
committed againe into the custody of the said shrd. until the said Joseph Muffester off his dama-
