The Condition of the above Recognition is such that if the above bounden John Jones his
heirs &c. or adnts or any or either of them do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the above named
Dorothy and James Phillips the sum of Thirteen pounds three shillings according to Law and the will
of the said Richard Phillips dead, when they shall arrive at full age to receive the same &c. Then the
above Recognition to be void otherwise to remain in full force and Virtue Preverale —

Rhoda Bowen - Whereas the Comisary Generale hath Transmited into this Court the balance of
bond to the Estate of William Bowen dead Wherein it is found that there remains due:
William Bowen : sum of the estate aforesaid, in the hands of Rhoda Bowen adnts of the aforesaid William
Orphans - Bowen dead, to One hundred and twenty seven pounds three shillings and two pence
in equal portions due to Mary, Eliz^t, Willm, John, Catherine and Whittington Bowen Orphans of the
aforesaid William Bowen dead - Whereupon it is ordered by the Court that the aforesaid Rhoda Bowen give

Thereupon the said Rhoda Bowen, together with
Soulby Whittington and William Hewitt her security are present herein Court in their proper persons
acknowledged themselves to Give and stand Justly Indebted unto the aforesaid Mary, Eliz^t, Willm, John,
Catherine and Whittington Bowen Orphans as aforesaid in the sum of two hundred and fifty four pounds.
Six shillings and Six pence per ann^m. Money to be levied upon the bodys good, or Chattels, Land, and tenement
Joyntly and Separately for the use of the aforesaid Mary, Eliz^t, Willm, John, Catherine and Whittington
Bowen their heirs and assigns if default be made in the condition hereunder written —

The Condition of the above Recognition is such that if the above bounden Rhoda
Bowen her heirs Executors and Adm^rs do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto
the abovesaid Mary, Eliz^t, Willm, John, Catherine, and Whittington Bowen their heirs, or assigns the
sum of One hundred and twenty seven pounds three shillings and two pence in equal Portions according
to Law and apprassment when they shall arrive at full age to receive the same &c. Then the above
Recognition to be void and of none effect otherwise &c —

John Hill - Whereas the Comisary Generale hath Transmited into this Court the Balance

Security
