Memorandum be it knowne by these presents that the Lord shire  
writ of attachment against the deft the tenor whereof followeth in these  
words vid. Ebenezer Cook - words vid.

Somerset p. Charles absolute Lord and proprietary  
of the province of Maryland and avale and Baron of Baltimore &c & the coroner of  
Somerset County Greeting we command you that you attack any the goods cattle lights or  
creditts of Ebenezer Cook late of Somerset County Gent if they shall be found in your Baili-  
wick to the value of four hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco and when you have the  
same so attacted or any part thereof delivered in your custody safe keep so that you leave  
them before the Justices of Our County Court of Somerset to be held at Bridgwater the  
third Tuesday of March next then and there to be condemned according to Act of Assembly  
to and for the use of a certain Joseph Cumberton unless Mr Ebenezer Cook by himselfe or  
his attorney shall appear and answer unto the said Joseph Cumberton in a plea off-  
ter upon the case &c. According to law and that by good and lawfull means of your  
Body with you make known unto the person or persons in whose hands you make the same  
attachment that he she or they be and appear before the Justices of Our County Court to  
be held as aforesaid to shew cause if any he she or they have why the same good cattle -  
lights or creditt so attacted in his her or their hands ought not to be condemned & execution  
thereof had and made according to the form of the act of Assembly in such case made provid-  
ed if to him her or them it shall seeme meet and how you shall execute this Writ that you  
make known unto our said Justices at the day and place aforesaid have you then & there this  
Writ witnessd and subscribed by the Justice of our said Court the twenty eighth day  
of November in the twelfth year of our Dominion 1727

At the white said third Tuesday of March to wit the nineteenth day of the same month  
Anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and twenty seven being the day of the Return of  
the said writ to the said Joseph Cumberton in his proper person and the coroner of Som-  
erset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed likewise comitted and made the Return  
thereof to the Court here endorsed vid. Attached full value in the hand of John Allen Esq  
ff Jno. Burnside Coroner -

Whereupon the aforesaid Joseph Cumberton prayd that the sum aforesaid attacted in the  
hands of the aforesaid Francis Allen, as of the Rights and creditts of the said Ebenezer Cook, may  
be condemned in the hands of the said Francis Allen towards satisfying unto the aforesaid Joseph Cumberton  
the sum of four hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco aforesaid as all costs accruing upon the writ  
of attachment aforesaid whereupon the aforesaid Allen alio solemnly called Cures not but makes default.

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that Nineteenth day of March  
One thousand seven hundred and twenty seven that the sum of four hundred and fifty pounds  
of tobacco so aforesaid attacted in the hands of the aforesaid Allen as of the Rights and creditts of the  
aforesaid Ebenezer Cook, may be condemned in the hands of the said Francis Allen toward satisfying unto  
the aforesaid Jos: Cumberton the sum of four hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco aforesaid as all costs upon  
the writ of attachment aforesaid and that the said Jos: Cumberton have hereof his Execution against the  
aforesaid Allen according to act of Assembly in such case made and grounded.
