hundred & twenty three, before Charles Ballard Justice & his associates then our Justice
at Dividing Creek & by Consideration of the same Court Recovered against Richard
Holland of all hallows parish in Soudett City Plaintiff adw. of all & singular the goods
& Chattels rights & Credits of Charles Shewell late of the City afo dead. Fourteen hundred
& fifty pounds of Tobo for his Debt which he sustained as well by occasion of the
Nonperformance of certain promise & assumption by the afo Charles Shewell in his
Life to the same Benj. lately made as for his Costs & Charges by him about his Suite
in that part Expedited to be Levied of the goods & Chattels which were of the afo Charles
Shewell at the time of his Death, & which to the hands of the afo Richard Holland adw.
as afo should after come to be administered if so much thereof in his hands he should
