the Holy Evangelist of almighty God in the preſente of the Complainant aſt the deſt of  
any touching the truth or remembrance of their knowledge or anything it may  
releate to the cauſe aſt, & that reducing of severall Depoſitions into writing you  
Send of ſame together with this our Commission under your or any three or two of  
your hands to us to our Cty Court of Sundett with all conuenient Speed Witneſſe Sam.

to us directed out of his Lordships Court of Sundett for bearing Date the Nineteenth day  
of Auguft anno Dom: one thousand Seven hundred & twenty five for the Examining Evidence  
for the perpetuating the Bounds of two tracts of Land aſt the one called Smith's adventure  
The Other ſecond choice &c

Thomas Brereton aged about forty two years be ſwore ſaith that his father old  
Jed: Parsons informed him by a valie near where M: Alexd: Adams house now stand  
at a tree that was then ſtanding, that, that, tree was the Bounder that diuided Mr:  
Brereton & Peter Gresly & tree being Blown down with the wind was cleaved to  
w: Commissioner further ſaith not. Iandy 29: 1725. Tho: Brereton -  
At the root of the above tree there was a cedar Stake flat marked with four Notches  
on four Sides

George Balie aged about Sixty three years be ſworn ſaith that forty years pefont  
he always heard it reported that at the aſt Balie w: tree stood that was w: divisionall  
bounder between Willm: Brereton & Peter Gresly further ſaith not. Geo: Balie -  
Thomas Brereton ſaith on his Oath that the ſecond Bounder of Smith's adventure was  
an old field pine ſtanding near the place where w: mill is built as he was informed by  
old Jd: Parsons Charles Mullin his father further ſaith not. Tho: Brereton  
At which place is ſtill a cedar Stake Marked with Sixteen Notches

William Alexander aged about fifty six years on his Oath ſaith that Jonathan  
Raymond informed him w: before mentioned pine was one of Gresley's Bounders  
and further ſaith not Will: Alexander -

Thomas Brereton aged about forty two years ſaith on his Oath that old John  
Parsons informed him that one of Peter Gresley's Bounders was a Stopping Oak  
(Standing)
