Peter Sirman said aged about fifty four years being sworn saith that he was at an
old tob^o House with J^r. Bersons who told him that house stood near y^e Line of Peter
Bresley & y^e Degoniant asked him if he draught the same Bresley's Land & the same
Bersons told this Degoniant y^e Bresley's former tree stood near his Spring with the
top hanging over it & he gave Peter Bresley a privilege in his White Oak Swamp
for the use of the said Bresley's High Land this Information was about 25 years
past & further saith not
Peter S^r. Sirman

Isaac Noble aged about fifty years being sworn and saith that about nineteen
years past he was at the House of J^r. Bersons & asked him why he did not exchange
some Land with Will^m. Alexander & Bersons told him all that heck was not his due
it was Peter Bresley's why said this Degoniant doe you work another mans ground who
answered yes (Blood doe I) and I give him a privilege in the Woolf trap ridge. Said he his
Boulder stands by my Spring But this Degoniant did not goe to see y^e Marke in y^e said
tree at y^e Spring and further saith not

Geo. Godart aged about thirty nine years saith that his father told him y^e one of Peter
Bresley's Boulders stood at J^r. Bersons Spring & that he saw a tree there plainly
Marked about twenty years past and further saith that he heard old J^r. Bersons
say that he was to have the privilege of what Land lay above the Branch for the
use of timber in the Swamp called the Woolf trap ridge and further saith not

Will^m. Hayman aged about fifty eight being sworn saith that about twenty years
past he heard old Nicholas Joadvine say that a white Oak standing at J^r. Bersons
Spring was one of Peter Bresley's Boulder & he Marked it or saw it Marked when he
was Will^m. Breton's servant & further saith not
William Hayman

Nicholas Joadvine aged about forty eight years sworn and saith y^e he heard his father
say that a white Oak standing by the Spring was one of Bresley's Boulders & y^e Bresley
Line would take some of Bersons old field & further saith not
Nicholas X Joadvine

By y^e Stump of the above tree is fixt a Cedar Stake Marked with sixteen Notches

Tho^r Breton aged forty two years or there abouts being sworn & saith that J^r. Bersons
told him that a little Distance from his Tob^o House there was a live Oak of Bresley's
Boulder & y^e said Bersons was angry with his Brother John and this Degoniant and
said they had cutt down the said Boulder for Squerill but this Degoniant doth
not remember the falling the said tree it stood about the Middle of the Plantation
as to the Length Length but near y^e Woods towards the Swamp & further this
Degoniant saith not
Tho^r Breton

Will^m. Breton aged about fifty one years saith that old J^r. Bersons told him
severall times that a little to y^e Northwest of an old tob^o House was the line that
divided him & Bresley this Degoniant asked him why he tended Bresley's Land who
answered it was for a privilege that he gave Bresley in y^e Swamp called
the Woolf trap ridge for timber which was a piece of Land this Degoniant
(apprehended)
