Steph. Coston - Stephen Coston son of Stephen Coston being of full age, to choose his Guardian according  
choose his to Law, comes into Court and prayeth that he may be admitted to choose a certain John  
Guardian --- Hanger as his guardian, which is granted him whereupon the said Stephen Coston  
marked chose of the afo John Hanger as his guardian, whereupon it is ordered by the Court  
that the Said John Hanger take all the Estate of the said Stephen Coston, the younger -  
both Reale and Personale under his Care, and that Mr Peter Benton deliver the same  
and further it is ordered by the Court that the afo John Hanger give Security to Comply  
with the Law in Relation to Guardians and to deliver up unto the said Stephen Coston all  
his Estate peaceably and quietly when he shall arrive at full age to receive the same &c.

Whereupon the afo John Hanger with Thomas Brereton and Wm Carter of the <sup>his Security</sup> Seaside  
all present herein Court acknowledged them selfe to owe and stand Justly ~~and debtors~~ indebted  
unto the said Stephen Coston in the sum of One hundred pounds Sterling good and lawfull  
money of England of their body's goods or Chattels Land, or tenements ~~privately~~ and sepa-  
rately to be made and levied for the use of the afo Stephen Coston if default be made  
in the condition hereunder written &c.

The condition of the above Recognizance is such that if the above bound Jno.  
Hanger do well and faithfully Comply with the Law in every respect in Relation to the  
Guardianship of the afo Stephen Coston, and likewise peaceably and quietly deliver  
up unto the afo Stephen Coston all his Estate both Reale and Personale &c then the above  
Recognizance to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue &c.

John Cornwell - John Cornwell son of John Cornwell dec'd is bound by the Court unto  
bound to same Tare while he arrives at the age of twenty one years, the said  
Said Tare --- John Cornwell being ten years of age the twenty second day of February  
next, the said John Cornwell to serve the afo Said Tare <sup>and</sup> faithfully the full term  
of time afo, In consideration of which Servitude the said Said Tare undertaken for  
to Learn of Said John Cornwell during his Servitude the trade of a Shoemaker, and to Read  
well in the Bible and at the Expiration of his Servitude to give him a new Suite of Cloathes  
whereupon the said Said Tare is ordered to give Security to Comply with the covenants afo

Thereupon the afo Said Tare with flutter file his Security before present herein  
Court in their proper persons acknowledged them selfe to owe and stand Justly ~~and debtors~~ indebted unto the  
afo John Cornwell in the sum of twenty pounds Sterl good and lawfull money of England of their  
body goods or Chattels Land, or tenements Separately to be made and levied for the use of the  
afo John Cornwell his selfe and affynes if default be made in the condition hereunder written &c.
