To the worshipful the Justices of Somerset County now sitting the Petition of William Selby

Whereas Your Petitioner stands possessed of part of three tracts of Land lying in Somerset County, One tract of Land called Bartners Choice lying on the North west side of Coromocke River in the Indian Town near Snow hill, the other two tracts lying on the west side, One tract called Singleton lying on the north side of a tract of Land called Burrum house granted unto Henry Bishop the other tract is that whereon your Petitioner now dwells the bounds whereof, of the said tracts of Land are like to become precarious and uncertain, your petition prayeth that your worshipful would be pleased to proceed and appoint Commissioners pursuant to an act of assembly made to take the probat of such Evidence as shall be to them produced in order to preserve the bounds of the said tracts of Land in perpetual memory and your petitioner as in duty bound shall pray -

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and mature deliberation thereupon had

Wherefore it is considered by the Justices here that a Commission Issue to the said William Selby as by the Petition aforesaid is prayed, and that John Burnall, Edward Rowland, Johnson Hill, and Dr. Beavins all of Somerset County Gentlemen are appointed Commissioners to execute the same Commission according to Law &c

William Abbott son of John Abbott, an Englishman aged sixteen in September next is bound by the Court unto John Burnall and until he arrives to the age of twenty one year, the said William Abbott to serve his said Master the full term of time aforesaid, in consideration of which service the said John Burnall undertakes to learn

him the trade of a weaver and to teach well in the bible, and at the Expiration of his servitude to give him a new suit of Cloathes, and a young mare, and young cow, and likewise find and provide for his said apprentice the full term of his servitude meat drink washing lodging and Cloathing mete for such a servant to have and wear -

Whereupon It's ordered by the Court that the said John Burnall give service by to comply with the covenants aforesaid. Thereupon the said John Burnall with Edward Rowland his security both present herein Court acknowledged themselves to owe and stand justly indebted unto the said William Abbott in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling good and Lawfull money of England -
