At which said next Court to wit the twenty day of June and Doud One thousand seven hundred and twenty seven came againe as were the afo Rowland Bevens and Mary his wife as the afo ~~John~~ ^{John} Townsend by their attorneys and whereupon all and singular the premises being seen heard & mature deliberation had it seemeth to the Court here that the afo Verdict is sufficient in the Law for the afo Plaintiff to recover against the afo Defendant as much costs and Damages according to the form of the Statute in such case made and provided —

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that ~~same~~ day and year last mentioned that of afo Rowland Bevens and Mary his wife recover against the afo ~~John~~ Townsend Thirly Shillings damage and by the Juries afo inform and assed as also three hundred and Sixty pounds of tobacco —

for to the same Cost, at their Request for their Costs and Charges by the Court here adjudged and paid deft in money due —

two pence curr: Money and Sixty Eight Bushells of wheat as by law herewithin Court pro-
vided may appear and so thereof Being Indebted the same Thomas in Consideration thereof
afterwards to wit the same day and year and at the County and within the afo Jurisdiction upon
himselfe assuied and to the same Hocken Hull then and there faithfully promised that
he when afterwards he should be thereto requested he the said Thomas the said sum
of Eleven pounds Sixteen Shill: & two pence and Sixty Eight Bushells of wheat to the
same Hocken Hull he would well and faithfully Deliv: and pay notwithstanding the same
Thomas his promise and assumption afo made little regarding but plotti-
ng and fraudulently Intending him self Hocken Hull in this part craftily and slyly
to defraud and deceave he afo sum of Eleven pounds Sixteen Shill: & two pence curr: money
Sixty Eight Bushells of wheat or any part thereof to the same Hocken Hull altho' the
said Thomas afterward to wit the same day and year and at the County and within the
afo Jurisdiction by the said Hocken Hull was thereto requested to pay and give him
for it in any wise remitted but the same Thomas the same letters to do hath altogether
