that we have appointed you or any three or two of you to be Our Commissioners to examine
Evidence on Behalf of certain William Jones in relation to the Bounder of a tract of Land lying
in the County aforesaid called Buck Ridge we therefore require you or any three or two of you
at your time and place as to you or any three or two of you shall seem convenient you
make on the aforesaid Land called Buck Ridge (you first having taken your Oath on the Holy
Evangelist of almighty God according to Act of Assembly in Such Case made & Provided) &
there cause to come before you or any three or two of you all such Evidence as shall be
to you or any three or two of you nominated by the said Complainant (or Defendant) and
that you examine them upon their corporal Oath to be by you or any three or two of you
administered on the Holy Evangelist of almighty God in the presence of the Complainant
(or Defendant) touching the truth or otherwise of their Knowledge or anything that
may relate to the same and that reducing the several Depositions into writing you
send the same together with this Our Commission under your or any three or two of your hands
to our County Court of Somerset with all convenient Speed witness Sam'l Hopkins
Gent. Justice of our said Court.

Somerset County. April the 15th. 1728. The Deposition of Mosey Tillman aged about
Ninety Years relating to the Bounder of a certain tract of Land Belonging to Edward
Beacham called Buck Ridge —

The Deponent saith he was living about
one mile from the aforesaid Land in the Year 1727 and he deponent saith that last
October he was a Squerrile Hunting and mett the aforesaid Beacham near the aforesaid Tract of Land &
the deponent seeing a no marked tree married with Sixteen Notches Standing near a Run
on dam side and he deponent asked the aforesaid Beacham if he knew what mark white oak
that was and the aforesaid Beacham told him that he marked that tree to know how far a tract of
Land that David Willm. Surveyed for him came over the Branch & deponent saith
that the aforesaid Beacham told him then that the Bounder of his Tract of Land called Buck
Ridge was about a quarter of a mile lower down the Dam & deponent saith that the
uppermost white Oak was not marked last March was a year and further the deponent
saith that William Lane Surveyor of d. aforesaid Land told him that the Lowerwhite oak
was the Bounder of Edward Beachams Land called Buck Ridge and further
