of almighty God and Laying his hand on the said Pine Stump deposed that about forty  
years ago Thomas Cox said. Showed this Depondent a marked Pine tree where said Stump now  
stands and told him that same was the first Boun-der of a tract of Land called Grinders -  
Demise all the said Cox being at the Survey of s<sup>d</sup> Land and this Depondent further saith -  
that he hath seen a marked Pine post standing at side of said Stump and coming down  
the said Branch on the south side of s<sup>d</sup> branch he brought us to another old pine Stump stand-  
ing as afo<sup>r</sup> and Laying his hand on said Stump deposed that Tho: Cox said about the  
said Pine showed him a large growing marked Pine which said Stump is still the  
Remains of said Pine which said Cox told this Depondent was s<sup>d</sup> Second boun-der of  
Demise and this Depondent declares that Long after s<sup>d</sup> Pine died and fell down  
and <sup>he</sup> knew the Stump and saw it several times after it was remarked being about  
ten foot high which said Stump had been cut down some time ago but by whom -  
this Depondent knows not and is now about a foot high Situate as afo<sup>r</sup> further -  
saith not Sworn Before us this 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1726 -

March the 15<sup>th</sup> day 1727.

These are further to certify at the request of  
said J<sup>r</sup>. Caldwell and by virtue of said Commission we did meet on day <sup>of</sup> and called  
Kirckminster and having summoned James Smith Esq. of said Town Smith showed us  
a tree being marked white standing on the South side of a Branch that goes along s<sup>d</sup>.  
North side of his plantation being a branch that comes out of a main head of water  
near and the said tree being a little below said Smiths house and Green ground and being  
by us sworn did declare s<sup>d</sup> tree to be a boun-der of his own Land & a boun-der of said  
Caldwells Land called Kirck Minister as by his deposition hereunto annexed will appear  
as witness of our hands the day and year afo<sup>r</sup> -

James Smith aged about forty eight years being sworn by us the Subscribers on s<sup>d</sup>.  
Holy Evangelist of almighty God deposed and saith with his hand on said marked  
white oak that Robert Wallace about twenty four years ago showed him that white oak  
and told him that it was the first Boun-der of a tract of Land called the Spring & that about  
that time the said Wallace told this Depondent his part of said tract being one moiety of  
the same and this Depondent further saith that about twenty years ago Matthew Wallace  
who was the aptaster of s<sup>d</sup> Land now in the possession of J<sup>r</sup>. Caldwell called Kirck-  
minster told this Depondent that his Land Bounded on the Land called  
the
