Return thereof that he hath here ready twelve  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  as by his said Breve it he was Comanded, and the Jurors of that Jury therein Impannell'd being called came to wit, James Martin, John Tule, Samuel Derickson, Henry Todd one, Josiah Bridall, Richard Rider, James Jones, Edward Jones, Wm. Mung <sup>Thomas Collins, and Hugh</sup> ~~Quincey~~ <sup>Thomas, Breerton</sup>, who being duly Elected tryed and Sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their Oath do say that the said John Edwards is guilty of the trespass and assault whereof he stands Indicted  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$ .

Wherefore it is Considered by the Court here that the said John Edwards be whipt at the publick whipping Post with thirty Nine Lashes on the bare back well laid on while the blood appear, and that he stand in the Pillowry halfe an hour, and that he be taken  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$ . Thereupon as to the Corporall Punishment  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  Command is given to the Sher. of Somerset County that he do thereof Immediate Execution by whipping the said John Edwards at the Publick whipping Post with thirty Nine Lashes on the Bare back well laid on while the blood appear and by sitting him in the Pillowry halfe an hour, and afterwards in the same Court Cause the said Sher. and Master Return that he has done the Execution of the Judgment  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  as to the Corporall Punishment  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  he was Comanded. whereupon the said John Edwards is ordered to Return home to his Master Service, and that the said William Jones his Master Return him to the County Court of Somerset on to the Sher. of the County to account to the County what tobacco they paid the County the severall Officers for fees  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$ .

One thousand seven hundred and twenty Eight with force and arms  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  at the Stegney Parish  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  in the County  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  within the Jurisdiction of this Court, One Duroys Coat of the value of three hundred  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  of tobacco of the proper goods and Chattels of a certain William Dragger, Eight yard of Strig holland of the value of ten pounds of tobacco Each yard, two yds and a halfe of Duroys of the value of six pounds of tobacco Each yard, Eighteen yards of Irish Linnen of the value of twelve pounds of tobacco Each yard of the proper goods and Chattels of a certain Alexander Drager, then and there being, and found them and there feloniously did steal take and carry away against the peace of the Right honorable the Lad Proprietary his good love and Government  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  *Bartholomew Propy*

Thereupon Command was given to the Sher. of Somerset County that he should take the said Timothy Souliard if  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  to answer  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  and afterwards herein the same Court Cause the said Timothy Souliard in Custody of the Sher. of Somerset County, into whose Custody  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  Before that time was Committed for the Sure  $\text{d}^{\text{o}}$  and being by the said Sher. set to the bar Indicted.
