and been afflicted this Long time humbly prays that she may be tax free and as in
duty bound shall ever pray --- Archibald Deal.

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood, wherefore it is considered by
the Court here that the aforesaid Negro woman belonging to aforesaid Archibald Deal be tax free for
the ensuing year &c.

Jacob Lodery } To the Worshipful Court of Somerset County now sitting the humble petition
petⁿ --- } of Jacob Lodery humbly sheweth that whereas your petitioner has an old negro
man altogether past his Labour and has not been able to do any thing for three years past
Therefore your petitioner humbly prays your worship to set the said negro Tax free and your petition
as in duty bound shall ever pray. ---

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and matured deliberation thereupon
had wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Negro man of the aforesaid Jacob Lodery be tax
free for the ensuing year &c.

William Ford } The humble petition of William Ford humbly sheweth that your worship would be pleased
petⁿ --- } to take me out of the List it being an old negro which is an absolute Cripple and
hath been so this eight or ten years, your humble petitioner doth pray your worship to Grant me
this petition as I shall ever pray --- Wm Ford ---

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and matured deliberation
thereupon had wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid William Ford be discharged
for the future from paying of Taxes for the aforesaid negro, as by the petⁿ aforesaid ---
