and been afflicted with Long time humbly pray that she may be tax free and as in
duty bounde shall ever pray. — Archibald Deal.

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood, wherefore it is considered by
the Court here that the aforesaid Negro woman belonging to aforesaid Archibald Deal be tax free
the ensuing year &c. —

Jacob Cordery } To the Worshipfull Court of Somerset County now Siting the humble petition
petu. --- of Jacob Cordery humbly Sheweth that whereas Your petitioner has an old negro
man altogether past his Labour and has not been able to do any thing for three years past
therefore your petitioner humbly pray your worship to let the said negro Tax free and your petition-
er as in duty bound shall ever pray.

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation therupon
had wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Negro man of the aforesaid Jacob Cordery be tax
free for the ensuing year &c.

William Ford } The Humble petition of William Ford humbly Sheweth that your worship would be pleased
petu. --- to take me off the List it being an old negro which is an absolute Cripple and
hath been so this eight or ten years your humble petitioner doth pray your worship to grant me
this petition as I shall ever pray. — Wm Ford.

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation
therupon had wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid William Ford be discharged
for the future from paying of Taxes for the aforesaid negro, as by the petition.
