To the foregoing order it was annexed ~~as follows~~ Vir:

Wee the Subscribers have viewed the Roads Surveyed by the order hereunto
and are of opinion that when David Wilson has Cutt & Ditch of three-
Foot wide and two foot Deep from Jeffrey Long's branch into the New Road ditch
and shall cause the said Causeway ditch from Pocomoke Road to Draw Clearly all
the way to the Beach and pine Ridge John Turpin to Cutt two hundred Yards
of the like Ditch to which he Agrees in part thereof. That then the new Road
proposed will be much Preferable to ~~old~~^{the} ones so far as the said Ridge —
and from thence we propose a new Road between John Watters plantation and
the head of Halls Creek on the South side aforesaid neck. Provided John and William
Watters Comply with their Promise as follows John Watters to Cutt a ditch off the
above dimensions from Annemes River through the Lowest part of
his Land into the Intended new ^{main} Road proposed or cause a Drain to be made
Equall to such a Ditch and that W^m Watters do the same through the
Lowest part of his Land and that each of them Cut or cause to be cut
two hundred Yards of the like ditch along the Intended New Road and
Further that a new Road from the place aforesaid on said Ridge be different from
any now in being, be made as direct as possible to the Nearest part of
Cap^t W^m Turpin's ditch who undertakes to Draw the water from thence
into Back Creek and from the Lower end of said ditch ^{to} the going over
of the old Road at the head of Maddox's Creek and from thence the former
old Road to continue down the Neck which we conceive will be much more
agreeable to the Inhabitants of said Neck than the old roads now in being
or to much the greater Number of them, all which we submit to your
Worshipp's Judgment —
