July the 17<sup>th</sup> 1790. Then came Andrew Scott before me the subscriber one of his Lordships Justices of the peace for Somerset County and made oath on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God that the above amount is due and true and that he hath paid no part nor part of the same sworn to before me

alleged of a hurt note setting forth the cause of action was made and sent to be left at the last place of the abode of the said debt according to act of assembly in such form made and provided &c.

At which said third day of August to wit the eighteenth day of the same month and year one thousand seven hundred and thirty being the day of the return of the said writ Cometh the said Andrew Scott by his attorney aforesaid and the sheriff of Somerset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed likewise Cometh and maketh return thereof to the said Lord Entores in these words following viz non est Inventus personam defuncti Johannis Burnall defuncti

Whereupon the said Andrew Scott by his attorney aforesaid prays that for as much as he has complied with the law in order to an attachment he may have judgment against the said Hugh Scott for his damages aforesaid by way of attachment according to act of assembly &c. Whereupon for that it seems to the said Lord that the said Andrew has complied with the law as alleged

Therefore it is ordered by the Justices the eighteenth day of August and year one thousand seven hundred and thirty that the said Andrew Scott recover against the said Hugh Scott six pounds eleven shillings current money of England and twenty two pounds of tobacco his damages aforesaid as also all costs and charges by the said Hugh Scott and expended about his suit by way of attachment against the goods, Chattels rights or credits of the said Andrew Scott and Hugh Scott according to act of assembly in such form made and provided &c.

William Callin } Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take William Callin late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in his bailiwick and him secure safekeep so that he might have his body before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at which day of August the third day of August then next to answer unto William Smith of aforesaid why with force and arms upon the said William Smith he an assault did make and him did beat wound and bruise without and other Evencities to him did to the grievous damage of him the said William Smith and against the peace &c. and that thereof he should not fail &c.

At which said third day of August to wit the eighteenth day of the same month and year one thousand seven hundred and thirty being the day of the return of the said writ Cometh the said William Smith by Thomas Bluet his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County aforesaid to whom the foregoing writ was directed likewise Cometh and maketh return thereof to the said Lord Entores in these words following viz

And the said William Smith by Thomas Bluet his attorney aforesaid Complainis against the said William Callin in the peace aforesaid as followeth viz Somerset County viz William Callin late of Somerset County planter was attached to answer unto

William Smith of aforesaid why with force and arms upon the said William Smith he an assault did make and him did beat wound and bruise without and other Evencities to him did to the grievous

Damage of him the said William Smith and against the peace &c. And whereas the said William Smith by Thomas Bluet his attorney Complainis that the said William Callin on the eighteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty with force and arms in and upon the said William Smith at Somerset County aforesaid an assault did make and him did then and there beat wound and bruise without and other Evencities &c. to the grievous Damage &c. and against the peace &c. to the Damage of him the said William Smith twenty pounds current money and three shillings &c.
