

Colony of Virginia. Were Summoned to answer unto John Shapleigh of a plea that they Render unto him one hundred pounds Currant money of Virginia of the Value of one hundred and ten pounds Currant money of Maryland - which to him they owe and unjustly Detained &c -

And Whereupon the same John Shapleigh by Levin Gale his Attorney saith that whereas the afd William Wye and Wm Wye Junr the Seventh day of Septemb<sup>r</sup> Amd<sup>d</sup> Dom<sup>d</sup> one thousand Seven hundred and twenty Eight at Somerset County within the Jur<sup>t</sup>: of this Court by their Certain Writing obligatory granted them selves to be held and Firmly Indebted unto the aforesd John, in the aforesd one hundred pound Currant money of Virginia to be paid the said John when afterwards they should be thereunto Requested Yett the aforesd Wm Wye and Wm Wye Junr altho' often thereto Requested the aforesd one hundred pounds un to the same John Shapleigh hath not Rendered but the said Wm Wye and Wm Wye Junr the same to Render hath Denied and still both deny and unjustly Detain whereby the same John Shapleigh says he is wronged and hath Damage to the Value of fifty Pounds. and there of he brings this Suit &c. and the said John Shapleigh brings hereinto Court the Writing Obligatory afd W<sup>m</sup> Wye &c. Levin Gale p<sup>r</sup> Q<sup>uo</sup>: Rodes J<sup>ud</sup>: Do<sup>o</sup> 12 Nov<sup>r</sup>.

And the aforesaid William Wye in his own proper person Comes and defends the aforesaid Injury where<sup>o</sup>: and says that he cannot answer the action aforesaid of the afd John Shapleigh nor can he say but that the writing obligatory aforesaid is the deed of him the same William, nor but that he owes the same John the afd Sum of One hundred pounds Currant money of Virginia, of the Value of One hundred and ten pounds Currant money of Maryland in manner and form as the aforesaid John Shapleigh is borne against him hath declared &c.

Therefore it is founde that the aforesaid John Shapleigh Recover against the aforesaid William Wye One hundred pounds Currant money of Virginia of the Value of One hundred and ten pounds Currant money of Maryland his debt aforesaid at his Damages by reason of the detaining of the same debt to three hundred and forty two pounds of to be due to the same of this afd by the Court here adjudged and the aforesaid William in merr<sup>y</sup> &c.
