And the said Hannah Waldron by Levin Gale her attorney declared against the said John Haristoy in the plea aforesaid as followeth to wit

Powerset County Jo. John Haristoy late of Powerset County merchant otherwise called John Haristoy of Boston in the County of Suffolk merchant was Sumoned to answer unto Hannah Waldron Administratrix of his Goods and Chattels which belonged to Joseph Waldron late of Marble Head married at the time of his death of plea that he tender unto her the sum of One hundred and forty four pounds One Shilling Current money of the province of the Mass: Bay of the value of Seventy two pounds and Six pence Current money of Maryland which from her he unjustly detains &c.

And whereupon the same Hannah by Levin Gale her attorney saith that whereas the said Hannah has admitted as aforesaid the twenty seventh day of October one thousand Seven hundred and thirty before his Majesty's Superior Court at Salem with and for the County of Essex in the province of the Massachusetts Bay by the Consideration of the said Court did recover against the said John Haristoy the sum of one Hundred pound ^{and forty four} Current money as aforesaid of the value of Seventy two pounds and six pence Current money of Maryland whereof the said John Haristoy is Convict as by the Record and process of the same Court yet in the same remaining appears which said Judgment yet remains in full force unsatisfied unreversed yet the said John Haristoy tho' often thereto required the afo' sum of one hundred and forty four pounds one Shilling Current money as aforesaid of the value of Seventy two pounds and Six pence Current money of Maryland unto the said Hannah hath not tendered but the same John the same witherto to render hath Denyed and still doth deny and unjustly Detain whereby the said Hannah says she is worse and hath Damage to the value of Ninety Pound Current money of Maryland and there of she brings this Suit - and the said Hannah brings here into Court the Letters of Comd^o aforesaid & Levin Gale for Dub: pldg. ^{John Doe} ^{Richard Roe}

At which said third Tuesday of August to wit the Seventh day of the same month and day of the said Court being the day of the Return of the said writ Comd^o the said Hannah Waldron by her attorney aforesaid and the said Jo. Powerset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed comes and makes return thereto to the Court her Endorsed in these words followeth to wit - Non est Invenitur ^{any} ^{more} ^{of} ^{the} ^{sum} ^{of} ^{one} ^{Hundred} ^{and} ^{forty} ^{four} ^{pounds} ^{one} ^{Shilling} ^{Current} ^{money} ^{of} ^{the} ^{Province} ^{of} ^{the} ^{Massachusetts} ^{Bay} ^{of} ^{the} ^{value} ^{of} ^{Seventy} ^{two} ^{pounds} ^{and} ^{Six} ^{pence} ^{Current} ^{Money} ^{of} ^{Maryland} ^{which} ^{from} ^{her} ^{he} ^{unjustly} ^{detains} ^{&c.} ^{and} ^{that} ^{her} ^{of} ^{her} ^{should} ^{not} ^{fail} ^{to}

Whereupon the said Hannah Waldron by her attorney afo' prays that for as much as she has complied with the Law in order to an attachment she may have Judgment against the said John Haristoy for her debt afo' by way of attachment
