Comfort Warrington Orphan and daughter of Thomas Warrington late of Somerset County dec^d aged fourteen years next May is bound by the Court of her said Court unto Benjamin Aydelott of the same place planter until she arrives at the age of Sixteen Years during which time the said Comfort her said Master well and faithfully shall serve his Servants keeps his commandments Lawfully and honestly every where willingly shall doe and in all things as a good and full Servant shall demean herself towards her said Master and all his during her Servitude aforesaid —

In consideration of which Service the said Benjamin Aydelott the said Comfort shall during the term aforesaid Learn to read well in the Bible and to knit Sew and Spin and other housewifery and likewise find and allow unto the said Comfort during the said term sufficient and wholesome meat drink washing Lodging and apparel and all other necessaries meet for such an apprentice to have and wear and at the end of the said term shall find provide for and deliver unto the said apprentice One new Suit of Cloaths both of Linen and woollen over and above her common Wearing apparel &c.

Whereupon the said Benjamin Aydelott is ordered by the Court to give Recoginace in twenty pounds Sterling for to comply with the covenants aforesaid &c.

Whereupon the said Benjamin Aydelott present Person in Court in his proper person acknowledged himself to owe and stand justly indebted unto Comfort Warrington in twenty pounds Sterling good and Lawfull money to be levied of his body Goods or Chattels Lands or tenements for the use of the said Comfort Warrington her heirs or assigns if default be made in the condition hereunder written &c.

The condition of the above Recoginace is Such that if the above bounden Benjamin Aydelott do and shall well and truly instruct and learn the said Comfort during her servitude to Read well in the Bible and to knit Sew and Spin and other housewifery, and likewise find and provide for the said Comfort during the said term sufficient and wholesome meat drink washing Lodging and apparel and all other necessaries meet for such an apprentice to have and wear and at the end of the said term shall find provide for and deliver unto his said apprentice One New Suit of Cloaths both of Linen and woollen over and above her common wearing apparel &c Then the above Recoginace to be void and of none Effect otherwise &c.

Ordered that a road be cleared from the Widow Donohoe on Peppers Creek to William Burton Esq^r Saw Mill and that sufficient Bridges aff^r ligys be made over the head of Creeks and Branches in the said Road where needfull at the aforesaid premises to be done by Wm Burton Esq^r and Wm Burton Esq^r by such Court next, for which they are to be allowed five thousand pounds of tobacco to be paid next Court &c. Said Wm Burton Esq^r to be overseer of the said Road &c.
