In consideration of which Service the said Benjamin Aydelott the said Comfort shall during the term aforesaid learn to read well in the bible and to knit Sew and Spin and other housewifery and likewise find and allow unto the said Comfort during the said term sufficient and wholesome meat drink washing Lodging and apparel and all other necessary meet for such an apprentice to have and wear and at the end of the said term shall find provide for and deliver unto the said apprentice one new Suit of Cloaths both of Linnen and woollen over and above her common wearing apparell &c.

Whereupon the said Benjamin Aydelott is ordered by the Court to give Recognizance in twenty pounds Sterling for to comply with the the Covenants aforesaid &c.

Whereupon the said Benjamin Aydelott present here in Court in his proper person acknowledged himself to owe and stand justly indebted unto Comfort Warrington in twenty pounds Sterling good and Law full money to be Levied of his body Goods or Chattells Lands or tenements for the use of the said Comfort Warrington her heirs or assigns if default be made in the Condition hereunder written &c.

The Condition of the above Recognizance is such that if the above bounden Benjamin Aydelott do and shall well and truly instruct and learn the said Comfort during her servitude to read well in the bible and to knit Sew and Spin and other housewifery, and likewise find and provide for the said Comfort during the said term sufficient and wholesome meat drink washing Lodging and apparel and all other necessary meet for such an apprentice to have and wear and at the end of the said term shall find provide for and deliver unto his said apprentice one new Suit of Cloaths both of Linnen and woollen over and above her common wearing apparell &c. Then the above Recognizance to be void and of none Effect otherwise &c.

Ordered that a Road be cleared from the Widow Donohoe on Beppers Creek to William Burton Ind. Saw Mill and that sufficient Bridges of Ropes be made over the heads of Creeks and Branches in the said Road whose need full all the aforesaid premises to be done by Wm. Burton Ind. and Wm. Burton Ind. by their joint meet, for which they are to be allowed five thousand pounds of tobacco to be paid next Levy Court &c. and Wm. Burton Ind. be overseer of the said Road &c.
