All which said next Court to wit the sixteenth day of June and Dow One thousand seven hundred and thirty came again as well the aforesaid Thomas Billing and Catherine his wife as the aforesaid Thomas Baker by their attorneys and hereupon the same Thomas Baker prays further leave thereof to discharge his wife the next Court and he shall it and the same day is given to the aforesaid selfe her also -

All which said next Court to wit the eighteenth day of August and Dow One thousand seven hundred and thirty came again as well the aforesaid Thomas Billing and Catherine his wife as the aforesaid Thomas Baker by their attorneys aforesaid and hereupon the said Thomas Billing and Catherine his wife pray Execution against the aforesaid Thomas Baker of the debt and damages aforesaid to him adjudged and the aforesaid Thomas Baker says nothing in bar or hindrance of Execution aforesaid of the aforesaid selfe by which the same selfe Remains against the aforesaid selfe thereof undefended.

Therefore it is considered that the aforesaid Thomas Billing and Catherine his wife Remains of the aforesaid selfe Whited have their Execution against the aforesaid Thomas Baker of the debt and damages aforesaid. Likewise that the said Thomas Billing and Catherine his wife according to the form of the Statute in that behalf made and provided Remains against the aforesaid Thomas Baker three hundred and thirty seven ... pounds of law for his costs Charges and Damages sustained by reason of delay of Execution of the debt and damages aforesaid -

And whereas the said William by John Gale his attorney Complaines that whereas the said Thomas the first day of May and Dow Seventeen hundred and thirty Nine at Somerset County aforesaid Whited had in default of him Court was indebted unto the said William in the sum of Seven pounds twelve shillings and Eight pence current money of England as by account herunto annexed may in Court appear and being so thereof indebted the said Thomas in consideration thereof the day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid within the jurisdiction of upon himselfe did assume and to the said William then and there did faithfully promise that he the said Thomas the aforesaid Seven pounds twelve shillings and Eight pence to the said William when he should be lawfully requested he would well and faithfully pay and content nevertheless the said Thomas his promise being aforesaid in form aforesaid made nothing regarding but plotting and fraudulently intending the said William in that part craftily to deceive and defraud the said Seven pounds twelve shillings and Eight pence to the said William altho' he came to doe the said Thomas by the said William on the aforesaid first day of May in the year aforesaid and often afterwards at the County aforesaid within the jurisdiction aforesaid he was lawfully requested both not paid but the same to him hitherto, to pay or in any sort for the same to content both refused and still doth refuse and deny to the damage of the said William of twenty two pounds money of and thereupon he brings suite &c -

All which said next Court to wit Eighteenth day of November and Dow One thousand seven hundred and thirty Ninty Nine Come again as well the aforesaid William Wake as the aforesaid Thomas Bredie by their attorneys and
