and shall make his personall appearance before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Bridgwater the third Tuesday of March next to answer unto his Said Lordships of what concerning what matters shall be objected against him on his Said Lordships behalfe, and stand and abide the judgment of the Court thereupon, and do not depart the same Court without Licence therof and in the meantime that he be of the good behaviour towards his Said Lordship and all his good people &c. Then this above Recognition to be void and of none effect otherwise &c.

Likewise it is ordered by the Court that John Carr Lewis Disharone, Edward Maglamery, James King and Daniel Longoe Give Recouerance in twenty pounds Sterling for their appearance at March Court to give evidence against the Said Thomas Duncan at Suit of his Lordships &c.

Whereupon the Said John Carr, Lewis Disharone, Edward Maglamery, James King and Daniel Longoe all present herein Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves to owe and stand justly indebted unto his Said Lordship in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling lack of their severall goods, and that all Land or tenement for the use of his Said Lordship his heirs and successors to be made and Lived if default be made in the condition hereunder written.

The condition of the above Recouerance is such that if the above bounden John Carr, Lewis Disharone, Edward Maglamery, James King and Daniel Longoe and every of them do make their personall appearance before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Bridgwater the third Tuesday of March next and then and there shall Give such Evidence as they know against the Said Thomas Duncan on behalf of his Lordship, and do not depart thence without leave of that Court, that then the above Recouerance to be void and of none effect otherwise.

His Lordships. Whereas George Layfield being bound over for his appearance at this Court to answer his Lordship for the said George Layfield came herto Court and prays that his George Layfield. appearance may be remitted to save his penitency from the ab^e Recouerance of Bail entred into as aforesaid. Whereupon the said George Layfield's appearance is remitted and he and his penitency discharged &c. Whereupon it is ordered by this Court that the ab^e George Layfield Give New Recouerance with one hundred for his good behaviour and appearance at March Court next &c.

Whereupon Captain Thomas Layfield of Somerset County Gentleman present here in Court in his proper person undertaken for the said George Layfield, and acknowledged him selfe to owe and stand justly indebted unto his Said Lordship the sum of twenty pounds Sterling of his goods and chattells lands, and tenements for the use of his Said Lordship his heirs and successors to be made and Lived if it happen the ab^e George Layfield fail in his condition hereunder written &c.

The condition of the above Recouerance is such that if the above bounden George Layfield shall personally appear before the Justice of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Bridgwater the third Tuesday of March next then and there to answer unto his Said Lordship of what shall be objected against him and stand and abide the judgment of the Court thereon and in the meantime to be of good behaviour &c. Then the above Recouerance to be void and of none effect otherwise &c.
