The deposition of James Hardy aged thirty years or thereabouts being sworn upon the holy Evangelist he saith that at this place being the place upon the River Side above mentioned in the former deposition where now is set a cedar post marked with sixteen Notches his father James Hardy told him it was the first boulder of his Land called Barbers Rest and divided between him and the Land of Richard Hule and further saith not.

And afterward the same day and year aforesaid before his Lordships Justices at dividing Creek in the County of Someth the aforesaid Edward Adams by Lewis Gale his attorney. and the aforesaid John Justice by his attorney aforesaid then and there his writt aforesaid against the aforesaid Edward Adams will not further prosecute with Effect but voluntarily permitted his Suit to be discontinued

Therefore afterwards vid. at that same day by discretion of the Justices here were adjudged the same Edward Adams by him about his defense in that point Sustained according to the form of the Statute in such case lately made and provided and the aforesaid John Justice in Money and that the aforesaid Edward have the cost of his Execution
