Now here at this day to wit the same day and year last mentioned makes Return that he hath here ready twelve as by his said Process he was Comanded and now here afterwards to wit the same day and year came as well the said Debt as the said Debt by their attorney, and the Just of that Day the said Just being called came to wit William Hardy John Townsend Esq. William Duns John Murrey Robert Mitchell William Colebourn Thomas Keene Walter Darby Abraham Smith James Dons, William Miller George Weston, who being duly elected tryed and sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their Oath do say that the aforesaid Thomas Bredie did assume upon himselfe in manner and form as the aforesaid William Wale above against him Complain'd, and that he payed the damages of the same William by reason of the non performance of the promise and assumption of beyond his Cost and Charges by him about his Suit in that regard to Eleven pounds twelve shillings and eight pence Current Money, and for those Cost and Charges to One pound of shillings -

Therefore it is Considered that the aforesaid Wale recover against the aforesaid Thomas Bredie his damages of to Eleven pounds twelve shillings and eight pence Current Money & one pound of shillings by the Just of in form as aforesaid as also two thousand one hundred and Eighty two . . . pounds of shillings for his Cost and Charges to the same Just by the Just here of this aforesaid of Justice adjudged which hath damages in the whole do amount to Eleven pounds twelve shillings and eight pence Current Money and two thousand one hundred and Eighty two . . . pounds of shillings and aforesaid Debt in Money &c. -
