Pettman and Peter Birman are of Somerset County Gentlemen Greeting I know yea that we have appointed you or any three or two of you to be our Commissioners to examine evidence on behalf of - aforesaid Alexander Adams of the family aforesaid Gentl. in relation <sup>To the</sup> to the <sup>complaint</sup> of a tract of land lying in the County aforesaid called Smith's Adventure We therefore require you or any three or two of you at some time and place as to you or any three or two of you shall seem convenient you meet on the aforesaid land called Smith's Adventure [you first having taken upon you to take the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God according to act of Assembly in such case made and provided] and there cause to come before you or any three or two of you aforesaid Evidence as shall be to you or any three or two of you nominated by the said Complainant (or defendant if any) and that you examine them upon their oaths both to be by you or any three or two of you administered on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God in the presence of the said Complainant (or defendant if any) touching the truth or remembrance of their Knowledge or anything that may relate to the cause aforesaid and that reducing the several depositions into writing you send the same together with this Commission under your or any three or two of your hands to us to our County Court of Somerset with all convenient speed Will of Samuel Hopkins Gentleman witness of our said Court the Eighteenth day of March in the fourteenth year of our Sovereign King -

On the back side of the foregoing Commission it was signed and sealed heretofore -

The execution of this Commission appears by the several depositions hereunto annexed -

Somerset. Depositions of witnesses taken upon a tract of land called Smith's Adventure in Somerset County upon the twelfth day of June and Dow. One thousand Seven hundred and twenty nine before us Thomas Gillis and Peter Birman in pursuance of a Commission from Somerset County Court bearing date the eighteenth day of March 1728 directed unto Lewis Hale Esq. Gentleman and us the said Thomas Gillis and Peter Birman we the said Thomas Gillis and Peter Birman having first duly taken the Oath and given the Molar by the act of Assembly in such case made directed

Isaac Noble of Somerset County planter aged about forty nine years being sworn upon the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God deposeth and saith

That William Brereton's fence in the year seventeen hundred and eighteen and seventeen hundred and nineteen which parted his plantation that he dwelt upon from John Wallow which the deponent verily believes was the fence mentioned and intended in a deed made to the Reverend Mr. Alexander Adams by the said Mr. Brereton as the deponent hath been informed dated on or about the sixteenth day of March and Dow. One thousand seven hundred and  $\frac{1}{2}$  began at the foot of Ackroyd's ladder (close by the backmost side of his said back) which is about twelve yards to the northward of a holly marked with twelve stakes and that the said fence runs from thence into Howard's little to the northward of a pine tree marked with four stakes by the deponent and John Thompson, the said deponent further deposeth and saith that he hath forty five years by past been a near neighbour to the said William Brereton and well acquainted with the said Brereton's plantation the said deponent further deposeth and saith that the pine tree aforesaid mentioned is marked as near to where William Brereton's fence stood as the deponent and the aforesaid Thompson could make it and keep to the last end of it and further will not swear to before us Thomas Gillis & Peter Birman
