Somerset County \bar{s} Depositions of Witnesses taken at the plantation of the virtue of a Commission to us directed out of his Lordships Court for Somerset County bearing date the 20th day of March 1729 for the examining ~~and~~ evidence for perpetuating the bounds of a tract of Land called Timson ~~and~~ \bar{s}

Isaac Noble of Somerset County aged about fifty years being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God carried us up to the head of a branch a little distance from the same near where the Road leads over a Saw branch and he said that his father near forty years agoe told him that a Red Oak standing near the head that leads down Wickaromoo Creek which blew down thirty six years agoe was a line tree that divided the deponants father and Richard Kimble but being asked whether ^{he} ever heard Kimble acknowledge the same he answered in the Negative, at which place there was a dogwood marked by order of John Leatherbury with three Notches on two Sides about forty foot to the Southward of the Road which was marked in our presents _____

John Leatherbury \bar{s} ; Wm Gottmandorff George Goddard of Somerset County aged about forty nine years being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God in behalfe of the Deft in Relation to the bounds of the Land aforesaid being the Second boulder of Lanten Dean who said that he was told by his father (George Goddard ~~of~~ \bar{s}) about thirty years agoe that a white oak standing in Richard Kimbles pasture to the East Side of Spring branch was the Second boulder of Lanten Dean and the first boulder of the Land called Timson in Indian and that he either denied the Chain or marked the tree at the Running of the Line and further saith not it being the tree that he proved before the Land Commissioners from which there is a line of trees marked with five Notches on two Sides which boulder was described at Request of the Deft the said Goddard was asked whether his father was at the Original Survey or at any Resurvey he answered he did not know .. taken before us. _____ George Dashiell Thomas Gillis . . .
