from George Bormans house to go through the Great pasture this deponent being asked what the Gutt was called
that runs up by ^{to be} Woolfords plantation his answer that Gutt was called Leo's Gutt and further Saith

Maryl. 8: 1: 1791 } John Tunstall aged fifty one years or thereabout being sworn on the holy Evangel
of almighty God saith that about twenty nine years agoe Samuel Worthington bought all of
Run of Mr Wilson (who had the management of Capt Wood's bush) and that this deponent
brought the like off Run to a Landing on the River and ~~had~~ he was told that they had better brought
it to the Great pasture Gutt ^{to be} Roger Woolford was then at his mother's and this deponent appre-
hended that that Gutt was the Gutt that Run next to Mr. Woolfords house for the best Landing and this
deponent further Saith that Daniel Burge told him that he went often to see his ship mate one
Anthony Smith a weaver who was a servant to Mr. Woolfords and they went often fishing in the
Great pasture Gutt, a gutt that runs up by the house where ^{Woolford} did then live and further this
