Lewis Gale Esq<sup>r</sup> who for his said Lordship in that part followeth Likewise do - wheresupon the aforesaid John Webb pray, Leav<sup>r</sup> to Imparte here-while next Court and he had it and the same day is Given to the firsaid Lewis Gale Esq<sup>r</sup> who do - att which said next Court to witt the twentieth day of June anno Dom<sup>i</sup>. One thousand seven hundred and thirty two came here a, well the aforesaid Lewis Gale Esq<sup>r</sup> who do as the aforesaid John Webb in his proper person, and the said John Webb relinquisheth his Verification by him above presented, says that he cannot deny but that he is guilty of the premises aforesaid in the Information aforesaid Specified above upon him imposed, in manner and form as by the Information aforesaid above against him Supposed, wherupon a, and Singular the premises by the Court being fully understood . . .

Therefore it is considered that the aforesaid John Webb pay to his said Lordship the Lord proprietary Six hundred pounds of tobacco for his fine the sum mentioned in the Information aforesaid contained whereof his County (to the use of Somerset County) and that the John Webb be taken up, and afterward at the prayer of the aforesaid Lewis Gale Esq<sup>r</sup> the aforesaid John Webb is committed into the custody of the Sheriff of Somerset County until he pays the sum aforesaid and all the Officers fees due by reason of the premises aforesaid, the said John Webb present here in Court took charge of the said John Webb accordingly . . .

Now know all men by these presents that on the twentieth day of June One thousand Seven hundred and thirty two before his Lordships Justice of the County Court of Somerset now held at Bridgwater (unto the aforesaid William Horsey in his proper person under Custody of the Sherif of the aforesaid County of Somerset and hath alswereing of the Indictment aforesaid, and saith that he is not guilty thereof and of this he puts himself upon the Country, and Thomas Bluet who for his said Lordship in that part followeth Likewise do theramonge command was given to the Esquuys of Somerset County that immediately they should cause to come persons to elect by whom he who neither he to recognize the Person as well as and afterwards in the same Court cause the persons aforesaid to wit William Lane and Henry Ballard Gent<sup>m</sup> and Robert Reddy
