Whereupon the aforesaid Paul Townsend by his attorney aforesaid prays the Court that upon giving Security
according to act of Assembly in such case provide that the aforesaid fifteen Bushells of Indian Corn (of the value of
Three hundred pence) so as aforesaid attached may be condemned in the hands of the aforesaid Christopher Banks as
of the rights and credits of the aforesaid Theophilus Dennis, which is to him granted &c — whereupon the said
Christopher Banks alledg^s aforesayed at the same day being Solemly called came not but make default &c —
