Anno Domini one thousand Seven hundred and thirty two being the day of the returne
of the said Writt Cometh the aforesd Adam Spence Senr. in his proper Person and
the Sher. off Somerset County to whom the foregoing writt was Directed comes and
makes returne therof to the Court here Endorsed Vizt. — By vertue of the Within
writt to me Directed to the Justices within Mentioned I Certifie that upon the —
fifteenth day of June one thousand Seven hundred and thirty two I Attache as —
the goods and Chattells of the Within Named William Shockley in the hand of
Charles Henderson and James Steel fifteen Shilling and Eleven Pence Currant
Money and two hundred fifty two pounds Tobacco and I further Certifie that
by John Barnes and Henry Garman honest and Lawfull men &c I made —
known unto the Said Charles Henderson and James Steele that they be and
appear at the time and place within contained to shew &c as by the Within
precept I am Commanded so answer as — Joshua Caldwell Sher.

Whereupon the aforesaid Charles Henderson and James Steel in their own proper persons and Geru:
sives of the aforesaid William Shockley came here into Court and the said Charles Henderson says that
he can not Certifie but that he has of his goods and Chattells of the aforesaid William Shockley in his hands
to witt, One Iron Bott, One Old pale and Windig Blade, and Leel which things are valued by a
Court here to Thirteen Shillings and Six pence, also the same James Steel say that he can not Certifie
but that he hath of the said goods and Chattells of the same William Shockley in his hands, to witt, one
Old Spring Wheel, two Sheaves of flax, four Old trenchers & one Old weeding hoe, all which things
so as aforesaid Confesed by the said James Steel are by the Court here Valued to fourteen Shillings, nor can they
say but that the aforesaid good and Chattells of the value aforesaid in their hands to be condemned which the
same party doth not Certifie &c whereupon the aforesaid Adam Spence prayeth that the aforesaid goods and
Chattells so as aforesaid Confesed by the aforesaid Charles Henderson and James Steel as of the proper good of
the aforesaid William Shockley may be condemned in the hands of the same Charles Henderson and James Steel which
to him granted he giving security according to art of assembly in such case provided &c —

Whereupon aforesaid Adam Spence said present here in Court under Tasker for the said Adam Spence saith
that in case the said William Shockley shall at any time here after will, a year and aday appear and make
all or any part of the said Adam Spence said claim against him to be satisfied or made before the laying
of this aforesaid Tasker that then the said Adam Spence said shall make Restitution unto the said William
Shockley of all or part thereof as shall be made appear to be undue or that he the said Adam Spence
said will do the same for him &c

Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here that the aforesaid Iron Bott, Old Pale and Windig Blades and Leel
so as aforesaid Confesed by the aforesaid Charles Henderson and Valued by the Court to Thirteen Shillings & Six pence
be condemned in the hands of the aforesaid Charles Henderson as of the good and Chattells of the aforesaid
William Shockley to satisfying unto the said Adam Spence said Fifteen Shillings and Eleven pence ^{and more}
