Hickey ad. Dawsey is like to become a charge to the County, he being begot beyond Sea; and his mother declaring herself to be an unmarried woman &c. Whereupon the said Joseph Hickey ad. Dawsey is by the Court bound unto the aforesaid Charles Hall until he arrives to the age of twenty one years, the said Joseph Hickey ad. Dawsey to serve his said Master his heirs and assigns in all Lawful Service during the term aforesaid, unless the said Charles Hickey at the expiration of his servitude, or at any time hereafter ~~shall~~ make for said Master Charles Hall Satisfaction for keeping and maintaining the said Joseph Hickey ad. Dawsey, which Satisfaction to be adjudged by the County Court of Somerset, and upon the said Charles Hickey making ^{such} Satisfaction as above, that then the said Joseph Hickey ad. Dawsey be discharged from this present Indenture and go free from his said Master, otherwise the said Charles Hall ~~shall~~ be bound to Learn his said Servant during his servitude to Read, and Likewise find and provide for him meat drink washing Lodging and Bathing sufficient for such a Servant to have &c. during his servitude aforesaid &c.

One thousand seven hundred and thirty two the same Paul Fagen in his proper person and being instantly demanded how he would acquit himself of the premises aforesaid upon him imposed; says that he is guilty thereof and every thing above said Expressly Confesseth. whereupon all and singular the premises by the Court here being seen heard and fully understood. Wherefore it is Considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Paul Fagen pay to his said Lordship the Sher. propriety for the use of the County &c. for his fine laid by the Court upon him imposed, for and by Execution of the premises aforesaid whereof inform &c. he is Com. thirty Shillings current Money and that the same Paul Fagen be taken to satisfy his said Lordship of the fine aforesaid &c. Whereupon it ordered by the Court here that the said Paul Fagen give Security
