In consideration of which service the said William McGlamney present before Court, Covenanteth with the Justice of the same Court, in Court Judicially sitting, on behalf of the same Nehemiah Cambell that he the said William McGlamney during the term aforesaid, he will Learn his said apprentice the trade of a weaver, and read well in the bible, and at the expiration of his servitude give him also if of two years old and above suit of apparel over and above his common wearing apparel, and Likewise find and provide for his said apprentice meat drink washing Lodging and Cloathing sufficient for such an apprentice to have and wear during the term aforesaid &c.

Whereupon the said William McGlamney is ordered by the Court to give Security for to comply with the Covenants aforesaid.
