prays that he may be admitted to chose a certain Alexander Stewart late of Somerset
County merchant as his guardian, which is granted him. Whereupon the said William Dashiel did make
choice of the said Alexander Stewart as his guardian — Whereupon it is ordered by the Court here that
the said Alex. Stewart take into his care and possession, all the Estate of the said William Dashiel, both
Reale and personale, and that the said Alexander Stewart give Security according to act of Assembly
to comply with the Guardianships aforesaid &c.

Whereupon the said Alexander Stewart, with John Hardy and James Dashiel his sonnes
both of Somerset County Gentleman, at present here in Court acknowledged themselves to owe and
stand justly indebted unto the said William Dashiel in the sum of fifty pounds Sterling money
of their bodies, goods, or chattells, Lands, and tenements, jointly and severally, to be made and
Levied to the use of the said William Dashiel his heirs and assignes —

If it shall please that the said Alexander Stewart do not comply with the Law, in relation
to the Guardianships aforesaid, and do not deliver up unto the said William Dashiel his heirs
and assignes, all his estate both, real and personale; that he shall have of him in his hands, and —

possession when he shall arrive at full age to receive the same &c.

Duncan Murray

To the Worshipfull the Lordships Justices of the peace
for Somerset County now in court sitting. The petition of Adam
Greer and Bartholomew McGruick most humbly sheweth —

That Whereas your petitioners on the 20th day of July and August 1729 did bind themselves
to certaine John Westcoat of Ireland to serve him or his assignes on the plantations in America for the
space of three years on condition that they should have eight days Liberty after their arraignment to get
money to pay for their passages which will appear by the said John Westcoats assignment
on the back of the Indenture on payment of which your petitioners Indentures were to be
void, But in stead of giving your petitioners the Eight Days Liberty aforesaid the said
John Westcoat kept your petitioners confined for Eight Days on board the ship in
order to barre your petitioners from getting the Money to pay their passages till on the
Ninth Day Mr. Duncan Murray came on board the ship and the said John West-
coat through want of Skill usage forced your petitioners to signe on the back of their
Indentures to serve Dunkin Murray for four years, Now your petitioners having
Served
