his Sureties all present in Court in their proper persons and acknowledged themselves to be indebted  
unto the aforesaid Francis Throgood Drummond in the Sum of forty pounds Current money of Maryland  
to be levied of their bodies goods or Chattels Lands or tenements jointly and severally to the use of the  
said Francis Throgood Drummond his heirs or assigns if default be made in the condition hereunder written

The condition of the above Recognizance is Such that if the above bounden Robert Neame  
do and shall well and truly in every respect comply with the Law in Relation to Guardians, and Likewise  
deliver up peaceably and quietly unto the aforesaid Francis Throgood Drummond all his Estate that he  
shall be part with <sup>that of Right doth belong to the said Francis Throgood Drummond</sup> both real and personall when he shall arrive at full age to receive the Same &c.  
Then the above Recognizance to be void otherwise &c.

all present in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves to owe and justly indebted unto the  
said William Bepper in the Sum of fifty pounds Sterling jointly and severally of their goods and Chattels  
Lands or tenements to the use of the said Wm. Bepper his heirs or assigns if default be made in the  
Condition hereunder written.

The condition of the above Recognizance is Such that if the above bounden William Burton do and shall well &  
truly in every respect comply with the Law in Relation to Guardians, and Likewise deliver up peaceably and quietly  
unto the aforesaid William Bepper all his estate that he shall be part with <sup>that of Right doth belong to</sup> and which of Right doth belong to  
the said William Bepper both real and personall when he shall arrive at full age to receive the Same &c.  
Then the above Recognizance to be void and of none Effect otherwise to remain in full force & vertue &c.

by the Court that the aforesaid Michael Holland have Liberty of turning a Road as by a petition aforesaid is prayed  
the new Road to be made peaceably good according to Direction of the William & the Dixon & they to make them equal  
to the old Road &c.
