John Day appears to his recognizance and is discharged by order of Court and Benjamin Cottman undertakes to pay the fee.

John Day appears according to the tenor of his recognizance; and is discharged by order of Court, Richard Whittle undertakes to pay the fee her.

Benjamin Cottman appears according to the tenor of his recognizance, and is discharged therefrom.

Richard Whittle appears according to the tenor of his recognizance; and is discharged therefrom her.

Edward Maglamore appears according to the tenor of his recognizance and is discharged therefrom her.

Burnside Niblett appears according to the tenor of his recognizance, and is discharged therefrom her.

John Patrick appears according to the tenor of his recognizance, and is discharged therefrom her.

His Lordship - John Patrick appears according to his recognizance and is discharged therefrom.

John Patrick is ordered to give new recognizance with One Penny, for his appearance at March Court next in the sum of ten pounds Sterling each to answer unto his Lordship concerning his begetting of a bastard child and stand and abide the Judgment of the Court here and not depart the Court without leave her.

Whereupon the said John Patrick with William Bowe of Somerset County moreover his family both present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves to be indebted unto his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the sum of ten pounds Sterling each of their goods and chattels, lands and tenements severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary his heirs and successors. If it happen that the said John Patrick do not make his personal appearance before the Justices of his Lordship's County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek in the same County the third Tuesday of March next, and do not then and there answer unto his said Lordship of and concerning his begetting of a bastard child, and do not stand and abide the Judgment of the Court here upon, and do not depart the same Court without leave her.

His Lordship - Henry Fitzwaters being brought into Court by virtue of a warrant of the peace in Henry Fitzwaters ordered to give security for his good behavior and appearance at March Court next her. Henry Fitzwaters with Geo. Dashiel his family acknowledge themselves to be indebted unto his Lordship in ten pounds Sterling each to be levied her.

If the said Henry Fitzwaters do not make his appearance at March Court next to be held at Dividing Creek and is not in the mean time of his good behavior her to abide her.
